Re: FY2019 Budget Update: Miscellaneous Requests

Elementary Health Education

In response to the discussion at the January 20, 2018 School Committee meeting and public hearing on the FY2019 Budget, the below table is being provided. At the January 20, 2018 meeting, it was discussed that funding be included in the FY2019 budget to facilitate discussions amongst building principals, PE/Wellness, and Counseling (among any other necessary departments) to implement consistent lessons across the elementary schools to partially address elementary health education concerns. While much of this work can begin during FY2018 involving the different stakeholders, \$15,300 is recommended to be added to the FY2019 budget. This will allow for teachers from departments to participate in meetings (providing 60 days of paid time over the summer) to address consistency across the buildings in anticipation of the 2018-19 school year. As such, the Budget Overview table has been updated below. All other impacted sections of the budget document would be updated when publishing the FY2019 School Committee budget document.
